## ABSTRACT

**Abstract:** *This paper tries to find whether there are significant differences by geographical areas in the fiscal incidence on inequality and poverty in Spain. Previous studies have looked to differences between autonomous communities or other geographical units. The novelty of this study is to look to the urban-rural gap as a driver of fiscal incidence differences on inequality and poverty. We use the Commitment to Equity Institute (CEQ) methodology of fiscal incidence analysis. The data used would be the Life Conditions Survey of 2018 developed by the Spanish National Statistical Institute (INE). The expected results would show if the fiscal system in Spain works differently in the urban and rural areas, and if it benefits one area over the other and by how much.*
